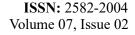

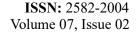

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The support for sports infrastructure comes through two distinct pipelines:

- i. **National Investment Pipeline (NIP):** Presently, over 90 NIP projects dedicated to stadiums and sports complexes are in progress. Approved sporting projects valued at \$1.49 billion include a 21% participation from the private sector in NIP projects' implementation. A notable NIP project, the Vishakapatnam Sports City, valued at US\$ 129 million, is slated for completion by August 1, 2024.
- ii. **National Monetization Pipeline:** Two National Stadiums and two SAI regional centers are earmarked for monetization in the fiscal years 2022-2025. The indicative monetization value for these assets stands at \$1431.25 million. The chosen mode of monetization involves an Operation, Management, and Development Agreement (OMDA) model, wherein a private concessionaire receives a 30+30 years grant from SAI, involving an upfront premium, revenue share, and annual fees.
